DIABETES MANAGEMENT COURSE

INTRODUCTION

The Directorate of Continuing Education and Professional in collaboration with Department of Internal Medicine of Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences are conducting a three Months Diabetes Management Courses from **August 1st to October 31st 2010**.

GOAL

The aim of the course is to train highly skilled middle cadre health care workers to be able to provide quality diabetic services at Regional and District Hospitals.

At the end of the course the participants will be able to:

1. Describe the magnitude of Diabetes locally and globally.
2. Organize and run a diabetes clinic at District and Regional Hospitals.
3. Classify different types of diabetes.
4. Efficiently use the different diagnostic techniques in establishing the diagnosis of diabetes.
5. Provide appropriate diabetes education to patients and their relatives.
6. Provide appropriate treatment to patients with Diabetes.
7. Diagnose acute and chronic complications of diabetes.
8. Timely refer patients that require referral
9. Collect accurate data on Diabetes that can be used to improve care and treatment of patients.

ELIGIBILITY

The course is open to health or public health related health care workers from Tanzania and other Countries involved in the provision of adequate diabetes management. Medical Officers (MOs), assistant medical officers (AMOs) and Senior Nursing Officers (SNOs) are welcome to apply for the course. Applicants who are actively working with Diabetes patients will be given priority.

CERTIFICATES

Certificates with credit points will be awarded on satisfactory completion of the course which involves active participation in at least 75% of the course sessions

VENUE

The course will be held at the Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences in the designated conference halls, The Muhimbili Diabetes Clinic, and the three Municipal diabetic clinics at the Mwananyamala, Ilala and Temeke Hospitals.

COURSE COSTS

- **Tuition Fees**
Local - 800,000TZS,
Foreigners – US\$ 1300
- **Meals (tea/coffee & Lunches) – 900,000 TZS**
- **Accommodation for 90 Days 700,000 TZS**

The course Organizers will make accommodation arrangements, to allow for adequate interaction and completion of assigned home works.

SPONSORSHIP TO THE COURSE

Participants are expected to support themselves either directly or through sponsorship by their own institutions or funding agencies.

TRAVEL COSTS

Travel cost is not part of the course fees. Applicants should look for additional funds to cover these expenses.

To apply, send application letter and enclose copies of CV, educational diploma or degree certificates and other relevant documents by post, email or fax to the Diabetes Management course coordinator. The Letter should indicate your qualifications, current position and how this course will facilitate your work.
