



BASIC OBSTETRIC EMERGENCY AND NEWBORN CARE SHORT COURSE FOR MIDWIVES AND MATERNITY NURSES

INTRODUCTION

The Department of Community Health Nursing MUHAS, in collaboration with Tanzania Midwives Association (TAMA), is pleased to announce the short course on Basic Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care for Midwives and Nurses **from 18th – 29th July 2022.**

Aim

The course aims to equip midwives and nurses with up-to-date knowledge and practical skills required to deal with pregnancy and delivery-related complications that threaten the lives of mothers and their newborns.

Course Expected Learning Outcomes

By the end of the training, the participants are expected to have the ability to:

1. Identify a woman with emergency obstetric conditions by using comprehensive assessment methods
2. Utilize appropriate skills for the management of a woman with hypertensive disorders of pregnancy, i.e. pregnancy-induced hypertension, pre-eclampsia, and eclampsia
3. Demonstrate skills in the management of patients with bleeding after delivery, including postpartum haemorrhage and hemorrhagic shock
4. Demonstrate skills in assisting complicated deliveries, including breech extraction, shoulder dystocia, and Vacuum-Assisted Birth (VAB)
5. Conduct an immediate and comprehensive newborn assessment to recognize newborns with life-threatening conditions
6. Demonstrate appropriate skills for helping babies to survive
7. Apply concepts of customer care and integrity in the provision of midwifery services

Target groups

The course is intended for Nurses and Midwives who are interested or working in the maternity unit. Candidates from both public and private health care facilities and training institutions in Tanzania and other countries are accepted. Participants should be directly involved with patient care.

Structure of the course

1. **Management of a woman with hypertensive disorders in pregnancy**
 - o Management of a woman with Pregnancy Induced Hypertension (PIH)
 - o Management of a Woman with Pre-eclampsia and Eclampsia
 - o Management of a Woman with Disseminated Intravascular Coagulation (DIC)

2. **Management of a woman with bleeding after childbirth**
 - o Overview of postpartum hemorrhage (PPH)
 - o Management of a Woman with Postpartum Hemorrhage (PPH)
 - o Management of a Woman with Hemorrhagic Shock due to PPH
3. **Specified skills for complicated deliveries**
 - o Breech extraction
 - o Vacuum-Assisted Birth
 - o Shoulder dystocia
4. **Helping Baby Survive**
 - o Essential care for every baby
 - o Helping babies to breath
 - o Essential care for small babies
5. **Customer care and integrity in midwifery services**

Mode of Instruction

Interactive lectures, problem-based learning, and simulation laboratory practices will be used for facilitation.

Course Instructors

Lecturers from the School of Nursing, Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences (MUHAS), and instructors from the Tanzania Midwives Association (TAMA) will facilitate learning activities.

Course Duration

The course will run for **TWO weeks from 8:00 AM -5:00 PM; Monday to Friday.**

Course Fees

Each participant shall pay a total of **Tshs. 600,000/=** for local citizens and a total of **USD 270** for foreigners for two weeks.

The fee should be paid through the online system using the **control number** as you will be provided by coordinators for local currency. Foreign currency can be deposited using the **Swift Code** system as directed by course coordinators

The applicant should pay the tuition fee at least one week before starting the course and submit a pay-in-slip on the day of registration.

Traveling Costs and Accommodation

Traveling costs and accommodation are **not part** of the course fees. Applicants will have to arrange the said services.

Award: MUHAS signed certificates with **10 CREDITS** will be awarded at the end of the course. Participants are encouraged to bring their CPD books.
